Yi-ngo in Yi-ngo district, exploded at 7:30 am. The second bomb exploded at 8:10 am at an intersection in Chanay district. (The Nation)

1506 hrs 22 FEB 07 -- Security in Bangkok to be tightened (BangkokPost.com) Bangkok governor [REDACTED] warned directors of 50 districts in Bangkok of possible insurgents' attacks in the capital in an urgent letter distributed on Wednesday. Mr [REDACTED] told the directors to work with police and soldiers to prevent insurgents' attacks, especially at crowded places like department stores, skytrain and subway stations. He said security measures to be stepped up in Bangkok around the clock to guarantee safety to the Bangkokians. Public are also urged to help authorities and inform them if they see or know something suspicious. Mr [REDACTED] action came after rumors circulated that insurgents planned to stage violent activities again on Friday. Insurgents staged a spate of bombings and arson in the southernmost provinces on Sunday night, killing seven people and hurting more than 50 others.

COMMENT: If the separatists carry out mass attacks in Bangkok, this will mark a new phase in their efforts to form the Republic of Pattani. (Tom Rudd)

1748 hrs 22 FEB 07 --Insurgents attack convoy of Queen's aide (BangkokPost.com) A convoy of [REDACTED] a confidant to Her Majesty the Queen, was attacked by insurgents in Yala province Wednesday afternoon. One police officer, who was riding a motorcycle to lead the convoy, was injured from the shooting while [REDACTED] escaped the bullets because she ducked down. Insurgents opened fire at the convoy of [REDACTED] at around 4 p.m., after she was returning from distributing goods to soldiers in Bannang Sata district. She is the chairman of a foundation to boost morale of soldiers, police and volunteers in the southern border provinces. The foundation is under her royal patronage. Police suspected that more than 20 insurgents involved in the shooting. Police and soldiers are hunting down the insurgents. Helicopters are also deployed to help trace the suspects.

(U) National Threat Assessment: America is, and will remain, vulnerable to small scale attack by individuals or small groups conducting direct action, IED, or VBIED events. During the past year there have been several events, including using cars as weapons; running over people, an attack at the Seattle Jewish Center, and the recent attack at the mall in Salt Lake City which, while not declared terrorist acts, all embody the principles of "lone wolf" extremism. To wit, the perpetrators may have espoused a cause, targeted specific groups or individuals, acted alone, committed violent crimes, and incriminated no one else. With the International Islamic Front's continued evolution and decentralization the potential for lone wolf attacks will increase. (Tom Rudd)
