**Student Worker Coalition (SWC) Meeting**  
**1800 - 01930 Hours**  
**04/01/2010**

I was unable to attend the meeting properly as when I arrived, the forum was a round table of primary Coalition members (approximately 14). I was the only unknown. I instead sat at a table neighboring the group. I was unable to hear clearly as their volume was varying and the students around us were loud. Here is the information that I have:

1. Agenda was a list of "to do's" to prepare for a May strike (date on flyer provided to Lt. Wilson). The group was dividing up responsibilities for locating a better "mobile" sound system such as PA system in a shopping cart they can hang signs on, who is communicating with UW Custodians, who is posting flyers throughout campus, who is communicating to the garbage truck workers (Allied Waste, Waste Management) who had an impending strike in Seattle area this past week and who is organizing scheduling a "tabling" area on campus. They stated they did not like the OLD QUAD last time. People just "walked past their tables and ignored them".
2. SWC voted "All in favor of a strike in campus say yea". Unanimous vote "yes".
3. SWC spent a majority of their time speaking about the "injustices" private garbage truck drivers are enduring with all their "Overtime" worked instead of the private owners hiring more workers. SWC went around the table anecdotally listing possible Waste Management pick up sites on campus ---- naming "somewhere near South Campus Center has Waste Management pick up of bio-hazardous waste". No one knew exact location. A person volunteered to investigate. A joke was made to deliver "garbage not picked up by possible striking private company garbage truck drivers to Gerberding 'offices'" Attendees laughed, but someone pointed out, "it's hazardous and we probably shouldn't touch". The group stopped laughing and agreed. SWC got a volunteer in group to reach out to Teamsters Union (Waste Management workers) to communicate
4. SWC believes that the private garbage truck workers are somehow "state" funded. They also spoke about who in the group would volunteer to go speak to UW Custodians at their "shop" sometime the week of April 5th to "connect" the concerns of Waste Management garbage truck drivers and UW Custodians, because the "issues to fight are the same". No building or exact time discussed.
5. Next meeting tentatively scheduled in Savery Hall 405 or 105 (Officer Van Leuven will meet with Bldg. Coordinator to see if SWC "reserves" rooms and which room it might be).

I placed a copy of the UW Daily from 04/01/10 in your "in box". It listed the UW Teaching Assistants (T.A.'s) are not happy and are possibly going to strike. I could not hear, but the SWC talked about another group to "join" forces. See that article.

I did not hear any talk about taking a major arterial or freeway. I did not hear where they would exactly "march" on campus. I will attempt to locate the location of the next meeting to see if a plain

clothes officer could fit in. This meeting it did not work because they all knew each other and I would have had to introduce myself. Was not an "open" meeting.
