Time Activity

- 4:30 SWC members to go to clock-in stations and parking spots for construction workers
SWC aims to get workers to join strike
- 6:00 SWC members will chalk to promote the strike
ASUW BOD Candidates and volunteers to begin posting lawn signs
- 7:00 SWC members and new students meet at HUB to bring supplies to UW W. entrance.
- 7:30 SWC will set up at W. Entrance
- 11:00 Speakers at Strike
Picketers will Picnic
- 2:00 Speakers at Strike
- 5:00 General Assembly meeting in Smith 205

Aside from this there may be other speeches and teach-ins throughout the day to rally the participants. The strike will focus at vehicle entrances to the UW and may interrupt university vehicle traffic, delivery trucks and buses. This strike may go on longer, though at this point there is no set end date. Most likely it will be a one day event. If a 'critical mass' is not achieved, then the focus will be on site #1.

Geography

They will start at 40th and 15th (#1/W. Entrance), as they get more people they will send a large mass to Pend Oreille (#2 / E. Entrance). From there another contingent will head up to 45th and Memorial way (#3 / N. Entrance). As the group on 40th and 15th gets more people they will send "snake tails" on Stevens Way heading east. The snake tails are groups that will be size-dependent on how much police presence there is. Along the way they may spill onto the street, delaying traffic.

Parking Lots

It was brought up by one SWC member that the largest parking lots are the following. However there was a proposal to block them was not passed.

E-1 with 3,000 Spaces (East of campus); Central Parking Garage with almost 900 spaces (Under Red Square); Portage Bay Parking Facility with almost 950; N16, N18, N20, N21, Padelford Parking Garage 650 SPACES; N1 & 5 about 400 Spaces (by Burke Museum)

Donation Sites

Other Attending Schools

Students from Portland State College, Portland Community College, Vancouver B.C., Evergreen College, and Seattle Central Community College are coming. From Evergreen, which sounds like it will have the most representation; it will be students from fair budget coalition, BSU and MEChA.

Union Striking

The extension, as you know was granted. UAW Local 4121 is not striking because they feel that a fair contract is possible. However, last Wednesday, the membership voted in favor of requesting a strike sanction from the King County Labor Council, which is still being pursued.

Fundraising

- The event on Friday raised nearly \$1,000
- Some sympathizers across the nation have committed monetary donations towards the strike, though at this point it totals under \$400.

Roles

1. There will be three **Chant Leaders**. They will be in charge of the bull horns and will enlist speakers to rally the strike participants throughout the event.
2. There will be a few **Donation Collectors**. They will hold buckets to raise money and will keep the money safe. These have not yet been determined.
3. There will be three **Media Liaisons**, who will be the contact people for news and other media. They will have a sign on their shirts. Others will direct media to them. These are already determined.
4. There will be four **Police Liaisons**, who will be in charge of communicating with the officers. They will be distinguished with an arm band. These are already determined.
5. There will be three **Site Leaders**, who will be making the decisions at each site (1; 2 &3). They will be in charge of deciding when to send more snake tails. They will also decide whether there is a need to regroup or send people up 15th, if the Memorial way starts to waiver. Each site leader will communicate with the other via walkie-talkies.
6. There will be three **Street Medics**, who are in charge of providing preventative care (water, food for diabetics, etc.), first aid (cool packs, wrappings) as well as emergency care for anyone (striker, bystander, etc.) who gets injured. They will be distinguished with a cross and a medical kit. These are already determined.
