75 Years of Vigilance



In 1935, a small group of union activists, lawyers, and intellectuals founded the **ACLU of Washington** to confront the political repression that surged amid the Great Depression. Devoted to the Bill of Rights, they defended free speech rights of labor activists, anti-war protesters, and communists. They soon took on racial justice, due process and religious freedom. Seven decades later, we carry on their fight in an increasingly complex world.

As we celebrate the **ACLU-WA's 75th anniversary**, the maxim rings true that "Eternal vigilance is the price of liberty." The ACLU's work is never done. We have become an essential American institution, protecting basic freedoms and advancing freedom's frontier.

In 2009, the legislature passed an ACLU-WA drafted bill which prohibits gender discrimination in community athletics programs.

Criminal Justice



In 2010, the legislature passed an ACLU-WA backed bill which bans the dehumanizing and painful practice of using restraints on pregnant inmates in labor.

In 2005, the ACLU-WA advocated on behalf of a Muslim group whose permit to convert a home to a mosque was denied by the city of Mountlake Terrace without compelling reason.

Religious Freedom

In 2009, in response to an ACLU-WA lawsuit, the Puyallup City Council amended its solicitation ordinance to protect the rights of U.S. Mission to spread “the social gospel.”

In 1979, Seattle became the first city in the U.S. to adopt a law barring police from collecting information about political activities without suspicion of a crime.

Government Surveillance



In 2010, the ACLU-WA gained a large settlement for an Olympia activist who was wrongfully arrested on the way to a peaceful protest because police reported he was in a car of “anarchists.”

In 1973, the state Supreme Court overturned the conviction of a labor organizer and attorney arrested while seeking to speak with migrant farm workers near Walla Walla.

Immigrant Rights

In 2008, the ACLU-WA won a lawsuit on behalf of 371 Seattle-area residents who had applied for citizenship, but endured years of unreasonable and unjustified government delays.

In 1993, the legislature prohibited the execution of mentally retarded persons – making Washington one of the first states to do so.

Discrimination

In 2007, an ACLU-WA lawsuit gained compensation and an apology for an Iraqi refugee who was unlawfully arrested and imprisoned by the Border Patrol.

NOW

THEN

In 2003, in a landmark ACLU-WA case, the state Supreme Court found that police must obtain a warrant before tracking an individual's car with a Global Positioning System.

Privacy & Technology

Protecting privacy for drivers, the 2010 legislature passed an ACLU-drafted measure limiting the use of electronic records of travel on toll facilities to toll collection purposes.

Drug Policy Reform

With our prisons overcrowded with people arrested simply for possessing marijuana, the ACLU-WA is working to legalize adult possession of marijuana for personal use.

THEN

In a 1985 ACLU-WA lawsuit, the state Supreme Court found that school officials cannot search a student's possessions without individualized suspicion.

Racial Justice

In 2010, in a groundbreaking ruling, the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals found that there is pervasive racism in our state's criminal justice system.

In 1991, after a campaign led by the ACLU-WA and Planned Parenthood, Washington voters adopted I-20, guaranteeing women the right to choose abortion under state law.

In 2007, the legislature passed the Healthy Youth Act requiring that if sexual education is taught in public schools, it must be medically accurate.

In 2009, the legislature finally ended the ban on voting by citizens who have completed their prison sentence but still owe financial debts – a modern poll tax.
