Limited Discovery: The parties shall be permitted to conduct discovery limited to the remaining issues described herein. The discovery cut-off will be

December 18, 2009

Dispositive Motions: The parties believe that the remaining issues can be resolved through dispositive motions. The deadline for filing dispositive motions related to the remaining issues will be

January 29, 2010

Agreed pretrial order due

April 14, 2010

Pretrial conference is set for

April 16, 2010 at 2:30 p.m.

Trial briefs, proposed voir dire questions, proposed jury instructions, and trial exhibits due

May 19, 2010

Length of Jury Trial:

3 days

If any of the dates identified in this Order or the Local Civil Rules fall on a weekend or federal holiday, the act or event shall be performed on the next business day. These are firm

1 dates that can be changed only by order of the Court, not by agreement of counsel or the parties.
2 The Court will alter these dates only upon good cause shown.

3 If the trial date assigned to this matter creates an irreconcilable conflict, the aggrieved
4 party must notify the Deputy Clerk, Rhonda Miller, in writing within 10 days of the date of this
5 Order and must set forth the exact nature of the conflict. A failure to do so will be deemed a
6 waiver. The parties must be prepared to begin trial on the date scheduled, but it should be
7 understood that the trial may have to await the completion of other cases.

8 **COOPERATION:**

9 The parties are directed to cooperate in preparing the final pretrial order in the format
10 required by CR 16.1, except as ordered below.

11 **EXHIBITS:**

12 The original and one copy of the trial exhibits are to be delivered to chambers five days
13 before the trial date. Each exhibit shall be clearly marked. Exhibit tags are available in the
14 Clerk's Office. The Court hereby alters the CR 16.1 procedure for numbering exhibits:
15 plaintiff's exhibits shall be numbered consecutively beginning with 1; defendant's exhibits shall
16 be numbered consecutively beginning with the next number not used by plaintiff. Duplicate
17 documents shall not be listed twice: once a party has identified an exhibit in the pretrial order,
18 any party may use it. Each set of exhibits shall be submitted in a three-ring binder with
19 appropriately numbered tabs.

20 **SETTLEMENT:**

21 Should this case settle, the parties shall notify Rhonda Miller as soon as possible at 206-
22 370-8518. Pursuant to GR 3(b), an attorney who fails to give the Deputy Clerk prompt notice of
23 settlement may be subject to such discipline as the Court deems appropriate.
