Ken Bell tells me that the facial recognition computer is under your authority, so I'm sending this your way.

At this point, that computer does not have Office installed, so we can't open Word documents, save emails, etc. Often, when we're working with facial recognition requests, there is a bulletin or email associated which we'd like to review as a part of the work, but we have trouble opening them on that computer.

Also, it has been recommended that we use Photoshop to assist in clarifying still images as a part of the facial recognition process. Photoshop requires a license and we don't have it installed on any of our computers, but it seems to make sense to have it available on that computer. In the meantime, we've been using free programs such as Paint.net to work with still images.
