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[PROPOSED] FINAL JUDGMENT

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Having considered the parties' respective proposals submitted in response to this Court's Order on Cross-Motions for Summary Judgment, ECF No. 108, and all relevant evidence and authorities, it is hereby ORDERED and ADJUDGED as follows:

- 1. The City of Yakima's current election system violates Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act, 42 U.S.C. § 1973, as found by this Court's Order on Cross-Motions for Summary Judgment.
- 2. The City of Yakima is permanently enjoined from holding any future elections under its current election system.
- 3. This Court adopts Defendants' Proposed Remedial Map as a remedy for the Section 2 violation found by this Court. Defendants' Proposed Remedial Map and accompanying data are attached as Exhibits A and B, respectively.
- 4. The boundaries of the five single-member districts depicted in Defendants' Proposed Remedial Map are reasonably compact, contiguous, and avoid splitting precinct boundaries wherever possible. The total population deviation among districts is 4.36%, well below the standard 10% threshold.
- 5. Only eligible voters residing within the geographical boundaries of one of the five single-member districts depicted in Defendants' Proposed Remedial Map will be permitted to vote in the general and primary elections for that particular single-member district. Every eligible voter in the City will be permitted to vote for the remaining two at-large positions.
- 6. All candidates seeking one of the two at-large positions will appear on a single list on the general election ballot. No primary election will be held for the at-large positions. Each eligible voter in the City will be given one vote and

he or she may cast that vote for any candidate on the list. The candidate who

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receives the highest number votes will be elected to the City Council as Mayor, regardless of whether he or she receives a simple majority of the votes. The candidate who receives the second-highest number of votes will be elected to the City Council as Assistant Mayor, regardless of whether he or she receives a simple majority of the votes. The roles of Mayor and Assistant Mayor, as set forth in Article II, Section 3 of the Yakima City Charter and various sections of the Yakima Municipal Code, shall remain unchanged.

- 7. The current system for choosing a Mayor and Assistant Mayor, as codified in Article II, Section 3 of the Yakima City Charter and Section 1.24.010 of the Yakima Municipal Code, shall remain in effect until the first at-large elections are held during the 2017 City Council elections.
- 8. All Councilmembers currently serving on the City Council will serve out the remainder of their terms.
- 9. The positions for Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4 will stand for election during the 2015 City Council elections. The position for District 5 and the two at-large positions will stand for election during the 2017 City Council elections.
- 10. The City's process of redividing its districts following the publication of the results of each decennial federal census will remain unchanged as set forth in Article II, Section 1, Subsection B(1) of the Yakima City Charter, except that the City shall be redivided by ordinance into five districts rather than four and the concentration of eligible Latino voters in Districts 1 and 5 will not be reduced any more than is necessary to apportion the five districts equally based on total population.

1	11. The existing Council-Manager Plan of City Government will not be	
2	eliminated or modified.	
3	12. If any further revisions to the Yakima City Charter are required to	
4	effectuate the intent of this Final Judgment, those revisions may be implemented	
5	without requiring the submission to and approval of a simple majority of the	
6	City's eligible voters.
